

Dear Friends.

Whenever I share with people what I do for a living, they often are saddened and say, "Wow, that is really a tough crime to combat" or "How do you do that?" In ten years, the theme that has foundationally grounded our 3Strands Global Foundation team is HOPE. Without the hope to change the trajectory of the problem, the thought of humans selling humans would have discouraged us all, but you see, we have the great privilege of working in the "hope space" by providing prevention education and reintegration to survivors and at-risk individuals. We educate tens of thousands throughout the K-12 schools with the PROTECT program and have served 136 clients to-date through the Employ + Empower program.

Webster defines hope as a desire for good, accompanied with at least a slight expectation of obtaining it, or a belief that it is obtainable. Hope differs from wish and desire in this, that it implies some expectation of obtaining the good desired, or the possibility of possessing it. Hope means there is a real possibility of A World Free from Human Trafficking.

Hope drives us. Hope of a teacher identifying a student being victimized so that appropriate resources can be delivered, hope that a client's new job will grant them the opportunity to choose safe housing, hope that the next time a teen is approached on social media by someone unknown, they will recognize the red flags of trafficking and not engage, hope that all those we serve will understand their true value and worth, and thus will be empowered to make their own life choices and pursue their dreams, hope that volunteers and donors will understand their impact- these are just some examples of what fuels us day in and day out.


As you read these pages of hope and impact, I ask you to reflect on your own role in the journey. Together we can impact the world and eradicate human trafficking.

PROTECT (Prevention Organized to Educate Children on Trafficking) is a scalable prevention education program which trains students on the forms, tactics, and signs of human trafficking, allowing them to better protect themselves and others from victimization. Through an online learning platform, educators are provided with access to trainings and standardized curricula for elementary, middle, and high school students. Through the PROTECT program, teachers are also equipped to recognize signs that a student is currently being trafficked or is potentially at-risk. The program provides the proper resources to prevent victimization from occurring.



Alongside partners, Love Never Fails and Frederick Douglass Family Initiatives, 3Strands Global Foundation co-founded the PROTECT program in collaboration with the California Department of Education and the Office of the Attorney General for the State of California.

3Strands Global Foundation's Employ + Empower reintegration program connects survivors of human trafficking and those at-risk (such as transitional aged-foster youth) with sustainable, trauma-informed jobs and the resources they need to succeed in the workplace, allowing them to create a new future – one free of exploitation.

Economic insecurity is one of the main vulnerabilities exploited by traffickers, and thus the lack of sustainable employment and financial stability is the reason many at-risk individuals are victimized and survivors return to a life of exploitation. The Employ + Empower Reintegration program aims to end a continued cycle of exploitation through a consistent focus on job readiness assistance, training and skill expansion, and job placement while also providing wraparound social work services.

Survivors have repeatedly shared with Social Workers that the most empowering action to take on their behalf is to connect them with employment. The Employ + Empower team at 3Strands Global Foundation meets with clients regularly to provide support during the employment process, helping to meet basic needs such as access to job and interview clothing, and to connect them with community resources such as transportation, education and childcare.

Ultimately, the Employ + Empower program aims to prevent future exploitation by offering a viable alternative to victimization – one that enhances self-esteem while teaching vital, transferrable job skills.

PREVENTION THROUGH **ENGAGEMENT**

Our Engagement program mobilizes communities and their leaders to stand up against human trafficking. We believe in the power of our voices and aim to create opportunities for individuals to engage with their political leaders through grassroots advocacy and hosted events, the largest of which is our annual Break Free Run. Each year, the Break Free Run brings together thousands of people, raising awareness about the issue and providing a unique chance to become a part of sustaining our prevention programs. With its innovative Virtual Runner option, the Break Free Run has spread its reach across many countries and continues to grow to new places and people year after year.




